Voters go to polls Tuesday

Area voters will head to the polls on Tuesday to choose between candidates running for village trustee positions as well as park board and library board posts.

While there may be numerous people running for office, the election has been noticeable only by how little attention it has generated.

Village of Morton Grove
In what has become a one-issue campaign, the We, The People party, the "outs" seeking to become the "ins" after next Tuesday's village board election, are relying on opposition to the gun ban ordinance to vault their party into the village hall.

The incumbent party, the Action Party, has listed itself as a bi-partisan group, which has returned integrity and ethics to

Morton Grove and has provided good services and stable government to villagers.

While the National Rifle Association denies any involvement in Morton Grove's election, the pro-gun We, The People party disclosed outside gun club money has been donated to the group. The Fox Valley Arms Fellowship, a Palatine gun collector's club, has donated \$1,000 to the political group. Another \$400 was disclosed as coming from a DuPage County pheasant hunting club, the Pioneer Valley Gun Association. The treasurer of the Citizens

In next Tuesday's elections Morton Grove's village board race is the major competitive election in the area.

It has become a one-issue campaign and that's unfortunate. The "outs", the We, The People party, are placing all their hopes on the controversial gun ordinance. They oppose the ordinance and are hoping enough residents agree with them this is the primary issue in the campaign.

The incumbents, the Action Party candidates, cite their work during the past years as reasons for voting for them. They contend they were instrumental in closing the paraphernalia dealers in town. They point to sewer studies and the Dempster Street study as important efforts made. They note they were responsible for the building of the new village hall and the acquisition of the new public works building. They note they've expanded the paramedic program and have computerized the business office. And they report they have created the most comprehensive senior citizen program in the area.

Since we are residents of Morton Grove, we will be voting for the Action Party. We favor the gun ban and believe the efforts of the trustees in passing the gun

Zoners study special use permits for satellite dishes

The Niles Zoning Board is expected to make a recommendation during its May meeting to change Niles ordinances making the use of large satellite television dishes subject to the issuance of a special use permit by the village.

If the ordinance is changed the result would be that any resident interested in installing a satellite dish, called a parabolic dish,

larger than three feet in diameter would have to appear before the zoning board.

During such a hearing the zoning board would listen to residents in homes surrounding the area of the proposed dish to see if there are any objections. Also, the zoning board would be able to consider the impact of such a satellite dish on the surrounding environment.

Niles Director of Building and Zoning, Joe Salerno, will contact Niles Village Attorney Richard Troy regarding the change in ordinance and will inform the zoning board about the possibility of rewording the ordinance.

Breakfast Rolls by Elpha Rabbage

1 pkg. Rhodes frozen dinner rolls (10 or 12)
1 pkg. butterscotch pudding (not instant)
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup melted butter
chopped nuts (optional)
Butter a Bundt or Angel Food pan. Place frozen rolls in pan. Sprinkle with pudding, brown sugar, and nuts. Drizzle butter over the top. Cover with a sheet of plastic wrap and let stand at room temperature overnight. In the morning, bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until done. Turn out onto a plate and break rolls apart.
