Local school districts seek to avoid consolidation

Representatives of School District 71 appeared before the North Region School Reorganization Committee last week to ask exemption from a plan to consolidate school districts that have less than 1,000 students. Also represented at the meeting held at Niles North High School in Skokie were Golf District 67, Skokie District 69 and Morton Grove District 70, which also asked exemption from the consolidation process. Niles gets 44 per cent hike in insurance rates

The Village of Niles received a 44 per cent increase in its liability insurance premiums in January, but the increase is "reasonable" in light of the soaring cost of conventional insurance, according to Jeff Bell, village finance director. Bell noted the importance of belonging to a group self-insurance plan which he said has saved the village hundreds of thousands of dollars over the years. District 63 ok's Gemini staff cuts

Despite strong teacher protests, board members of East Maine School District 63 approved cutting one of three teaching teams, five teachers, for the next school year in Gemini Junior High School, Niles. Also approved at the Feb. 11 meeting was a vote to cut one physical education teacher from the Gemini staff. Both moves were in board response to administrative recommendations for the use of facilities, curriculum and staffing. In presenting the recommendations, Dr. Donald Bond, superintendent, said cutting a team at Gemini would save the District about \$200,000 a year. The District, said Bond, is projecting. Social Security earnings limit goes up

If you plan to work and want to receive all of your Social Security benefits, the amount you are allowed to earn in 1986 will increase. If you are between ages 65 and 70, the limit will be \$7,800. If you are under age 65, the limit will be \$5,760.

If your earnings exceed the annual limit, Social Security will withhold \$1 in benefits for each \$2 you earn above the exempt amount. Even if your earnings are above the exempt amount for the year, some Social Security benefits may still be payable. For example, if you are 65 with a monthly benefit of \$425, you could earn \$18,000 in 1986 before all benefits are withheld.

You must count your earnings for the whole year in figuring

benefits due you. For most people this means January through December. If you are an employee count the gross wages you earn during the year, not just take home pay. If you're a self-employed person, count your net profit or loss from any enterprise in which you are a sole owner or partner.

The following types of income don't count as earnings. *Investment income in the form of dividends from stock you own unless you are a dealer in securities.

*Interest on savings accounts.

*Income from Social Security benefits, pensions, other retirement pay or VA benefits.

*Income from annuities.

*Gain or loss from the sale of capital assets.

*Gifts or inheritances.

*Rental income from real estate you own, unless you are a real estate dealer.

*Royalties you receive in or after the year you became 65 from patents or copyrights that were obtained before that year.

*Income from a limited partnership.

VALENTINE THUMPING

Hear about the latest information concerning pacemakers by attending a special lecture and demonstration by Florence Phillips, R.N., from the Center for Vascular Studies. This Valentine's Day event will be held at 1:30 and 2:15 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 14 in the Anderson Lounge at Bethany Methodist Terrace, 8425 Waukegan rd. in Morton Grove. The latest information on indications for use, monitoring and CPR on the pacemaker patient will be discussed.

HEMOCCULT TESTING

A Hemocult Test is a simple and convenient method for individuals to test themselves for diseases of the colon. The test will detect blood in the stool before it can be seen and is very helpful in detecting early colon cancer. Early colon cancer is highly curable, often by removal of a polyp or affected tissue. Kits and instruction for usage can be picked up from 9 to 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 25 from the geriatric nurse, Laurie O'Reilly in the Village Hall Senior Center. An appointment will also be arranged to evaluate test results. Kits and test evaluations are free of charge to Morton Grove residents. LICENSE DISCOUNT

The Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons Property Tax Relief Act, or Circuit Breaker, was established in 1972 to reduce the tax burden on the limited incomes of many senior and disabled citizens in Illinois. Now, all persons receiving the Circuit Breaker tax relief benefits are eligible for a fifty percent reduction in the cost of one set of license plates. To qualify for a Circuit Breaker grant, an applicant must: be age 65 or older or age 18 and older and disabled; have an annual household income under \$14,000; and, be an Illinois resident. This discount may be applied to a new, registration or registration renewal for a passenger car, handicap license, "B" truck, or recreational vehicle of 8,000 lbs. or less. FLASHING LIGHT

Infirm and disabled Morton Grove residents can now purchase a Remote Control Flashing Light System that will enable them to call for medical or emergency assistance. The system is composed of a portable transmitter, receiver, and a flashing red strobe light placed in a street-facing window of the home. In case of an emergency such as fall or dizziness the resident can activate the light to alert neighbors, cruising police cars and other residents that help is needed. The strobe light brightness is intense, measuring 500,000 candlepower similar to that of an airplane wing light. The cost of the system is \$80, for further distribution information or to have the system explained to clubs or groups, contact the Senior Hot Line any weekday morning at 965-4658.



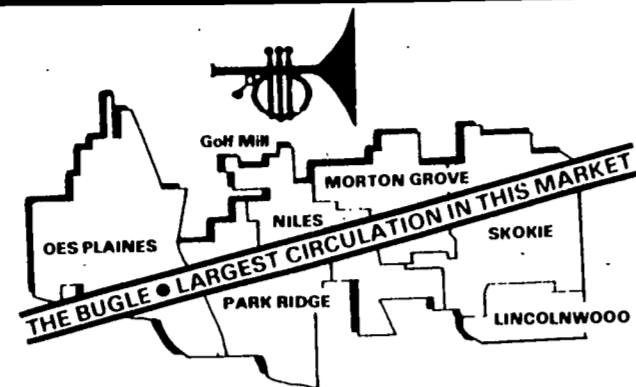

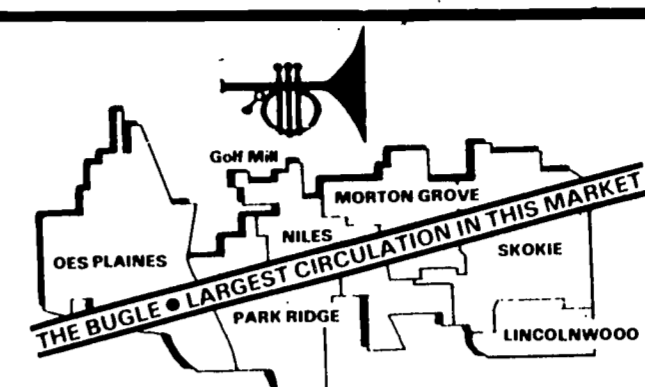
